

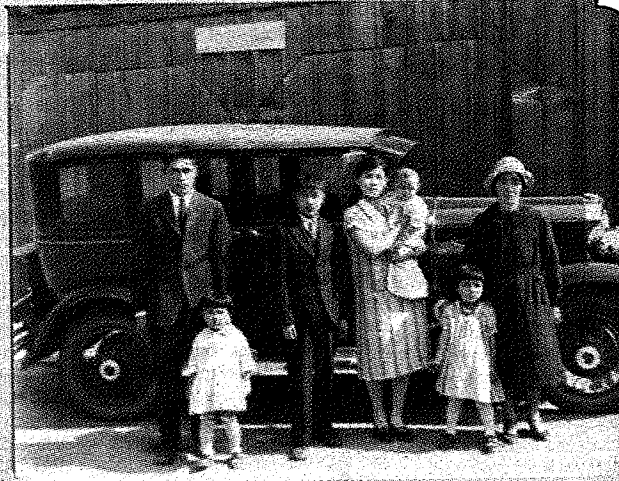

Rich Avila history

The South County Historical Society invites everyone to the grand opening of its IOOF Historic Hall in Arroyo Grande from 1 to 5 p.m. with a ceremony at 2 p.m. on **Sept. 30**. The featured exhibit covers Avila Beach's history by displaying more than a dozen vignettes of the community's history through different time periods. From the Chumash Indians to the commercial development of the beach in the 1870s, this exhibit includes the history of a railroad extension to Los Olivos, development of an oil port, discovery of hot springs, the planting of apple orchards, and more.
