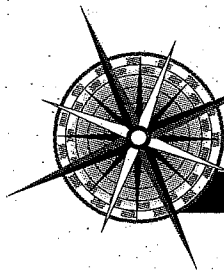

The Historic IOOF Hall opened its doors to the public this weekend for the first time in over 20 years. More than 100 people gathered at the Hall this weekend for the opening of South County Historical Society Summer Exhibits. The display, featuring the Great Depression of the 1930s through two exhibits: "Behind a Lens: The Photography of Dorothea Lange" and "The Civilian Conservation Corps, A Bridge to Recovery" as well as the history of Abalone Harvesting in San Luis Obispo County, is available to the public free of charge through the end of September.
